## A real must for Gilmour fans

David Gilmour fans who missed his On An Island concert at the Royal Albert Hall last year now have the chance to experience what was described as a 'near-perfect gig' when a track off the DVD is screened at the Regal cinema on September 6th.

The DVD features special guest appearances from David Bowie, Robert Wyatt, David Crosby and Graham Nash as well as 2 hours and 40 minutes of extras, notably an amazing fly on-the-wall documentary following Gilmour and his band on tour. A 20-page booklet accompanies the DVD.

The two-and-a-half-hour concert featured band members Richard Wright of Pink Floyd, Phil Manzanera of Roxy Music, new boy Steve DiStanislao on drums, plus Pink Floyd regulars Dick Parry, Guy Pratt and Jon Carin.

The live Henley showing will feature the launch of the DVD at the Odeon Leicester Square in London where Gilmour will perform a track and answer questions following an 85 minute preview of the recording.

The two disc DVD set, Remember That Night, has on disc one the five star reviewed concert comprising the number one album On An Island and Pink Floyd classics such as High Hopes, Shine on You Crazy Diamond, Comfortably Numb and the first filmed performance (since Pink Floyd's Live at Pompeii) of Echoes, the 20 minute tour de force.

The concert's lasers and smoke come courtesy of lighting genius Marc Brickman and it is filmed by David Mallet, one of the world's leading music directors. For the 23-camera shoot Mallet used the very latest high definition digital technology and the results are stunning. This groundbreaking 'must have' DVD will be available in Standard DVD, HD-DVD and in BluRay.

Remember That Night disc 2 is packed with rarities and previously unreleased material. Breaking Bread, Drinking Wine is a 46 minute road movie filmed during the 2006 tour and allows fans a unique 'seat on the tour bus'. It shows a rare glimpse of Gilmour, the man and musician, his band and crew enjoying and enduring the highs and the lows of life on tour — from flash floods, a collapsing stage, a Russian wine-glass player, and problems with German trains!

Other extras include bonus tracks from the Royal Albert Hall, Gilmour's first ever performance of the Syd Barrett classic *Dark Globe, Astronomy Domine* at Live From Abbey Road, and the AOL sessions recorded while on tour in LA. Five songs from the BBC Mermaid Theatre concert are also on disc 2, along with a five-minute documentary shot on tour whilst in LA. Plus a photo gallery featuring the tour crew, shot by tour photographer Polly Samson.

The 20-page booklet features over 80 photos.
